

## **Eighth Grade Homeroom Information**

### **Classroom Rules:**

Arrive on time with all of your materials  
Remain silent while the teacher or a classmate is talking  
Remain in seat unless given permission to move  
Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself  
Talk respectfully – no put downs, interruptions, or arguing

### **Dress Code:**

Please take time to read pages 42 and 43 of the Student/Parent Handbook.  
Remember – no tank tops may be visible under polo shirts, socks must be visible with shoes on, non school uniform sweaters, sweatshirts, and jackets may not be worn inside any classroom. Any student not following the dress code will be given a dress code violation slip and asked to return to their homeroom teacher for follow up.

### **Assignment Notebooks**

Assignment notebooks are very helpful in teaching the organization skills that you will need in high school. I will require you to buy the school assignment book to keep track of your assignments. I will be checking these from time to time and encouraging your parents to ask for them as well.

### **Absences:**

You must make up any missed work when absent from class. If you are absent, work can be obtained from other students or by asking the teacher. For each day absent, you have 2 school days to make up the work. In the event of a prearranged absence, it is your responsibility to make arrangements with the teacher to “make up” missed work upon return.

### **Late Work Policy:**

Late work receives 15% grade reduction (except for absences) and may be turned in up to one week late. A paper is late if it is not handed in at the time I call for it, including papers that may need to be printed. **Late work will not be accepted after one week.**

### **Grading:**

Grades will be determined on a straight percentage scale, based on the total number of points possible. Following is the grading scale.

Each month, half the class will prepare, serve, and clean up after a meal for the residents. We will then stay to join the staff for lunch.

### **Transition Projects**

Each 8<sup>th</sup> grader will help to prepare or serve a meal for transition projects. This is a great way for you to live out the lessons you are learning both here and at home. In addition, this kind of activity is one of the things that high school admissions directors look at in trying to assess a student for placement and/or scholarship aid.
